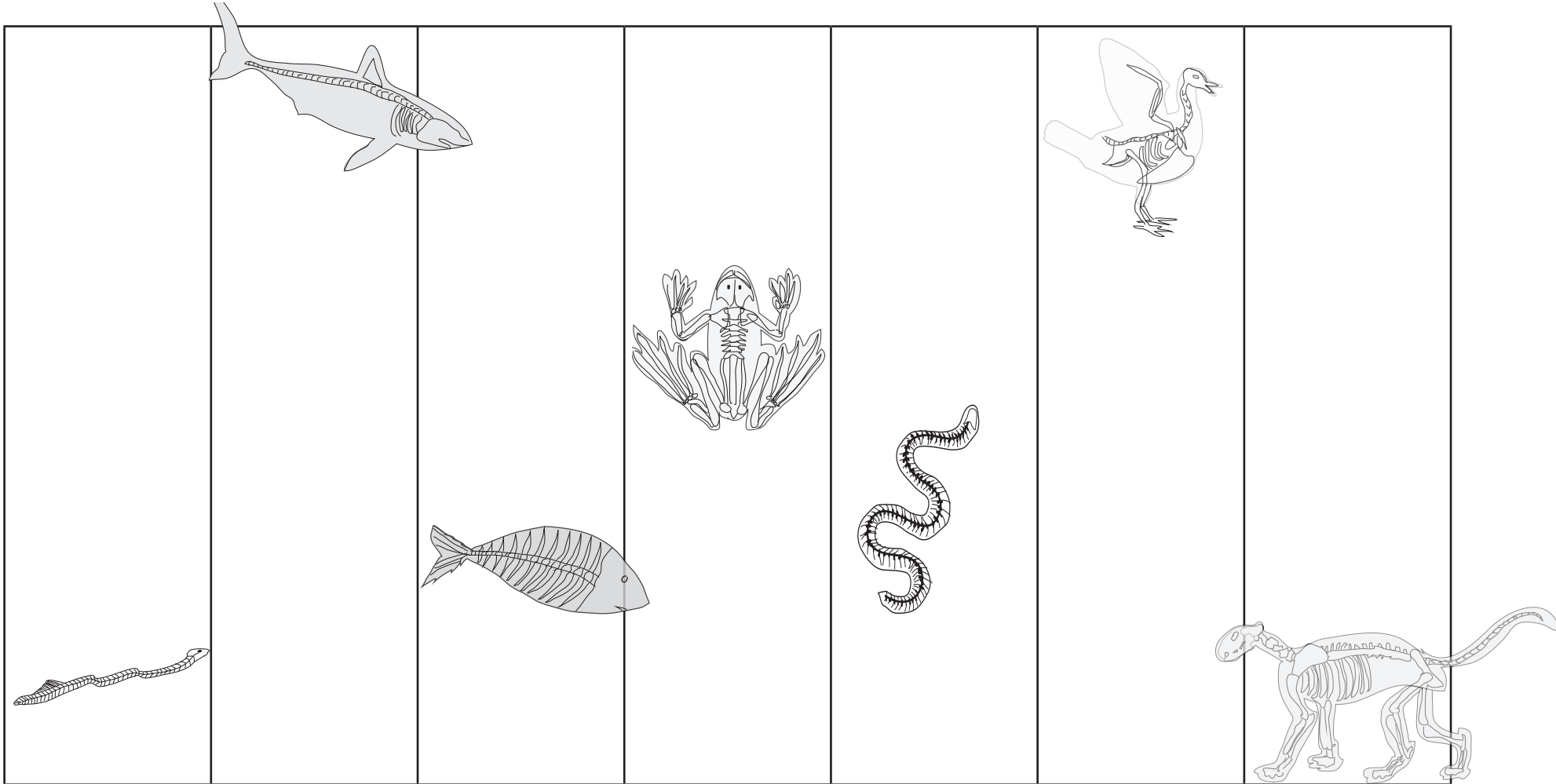









List the seven classes in the family vertebrate.
